Our weekly collection is for the Parish, not Fr Adrian, and as he receives no salary your offering at Christmas helps to support him over the next six months, thank you.

Our Grand Draw 14 December: Many thanks to all who contributed to last weekend's celebrations: the net profit achieved was a magnificent £3,193.35 which goes to the Fr Tom Memorial Fund. The fund closes at the end of December and to date the Parish has raised over £25,000 so thank you for all your endeavours. The last fund-raising effort will be a sponsored swim by Wigberto 'Wiggy' De Souza, to which a number of people have already pledged. Although Wiggy is not back from India until February his sponsorship pledges will count towards our final figure. Some prizes from Our Grand Draw still remain unclaimed so please see Peter Beaumont after Mass, including Mila Maconging [please forgive any incorrect spelling] as it is most important that they contact Peter as soon as possible.

Thank you to all those who have contributed hamper-style gifts so far to the Parish's annual collection for local families and individuals in need. If you haven't been able to contribute so far we are seeking donations of biscuits, chocolates, etc. to give to our parishioners resident in Windmill Lodge and to local individuals and families in particular need. Donations can be placed before or after our Masses this weekend in the large box just inside the Sacristy door. Thank you.

Our Christmas giving continues through the traditional Crib donations that our Diocese asks us to consider. This time each year the money from our crib collections support the work of the Cabrini Children's Society, so please visit our Crib and make a prayerful donation to help support vulnerable children in the year ahead. Thank you.



In addition to the Diocesan collection we will again be collecting toiletries at the Crib over the Christmas period for the Jesuit Refugee Service, the Women at the Well charity and this year also for those in Brixton prison. Please leave all unopened toiletries such as individual shower Gel, shampoo, soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant as well as nappies, and sanitary wear in the baskets by the Crib. Items in larger amounts are also welcome as the toiletry baskets (and Cabrini collection basket) will be emptied after each Mass. Thank you.
