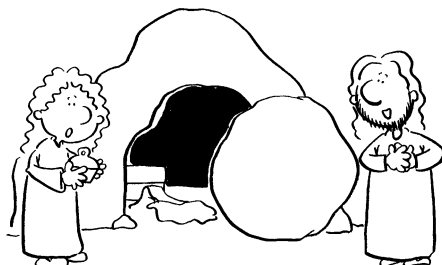

Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee.

That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious king, thy mercy show!

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia ...**

Christ, our Passover, has been sacrificed; let us celebrate the feast then, in the Lord. Alleluia...

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John [20: 1-9]
He must rise from the dead

We stand to renew our baptismal vows:
