Fr. Michael Kirwan SJ writes: "I am currently in El Salvador, in Central America, where I am attending the 25th anniversary commemoration of the killing of six Jesuit priests and two women during the civil war in El Salvador in 1989. The actual anniversary is 16th November, this Sunday. We will have mass in the crypt of the cathedral, where Archbishop Romero is buried (Romero was himself shot dead in 1980, while celebrating mass). There are lots of people gathering from all over the world, for a series of cultural and devotional events, including art and drama, some academic talks (these are quite dull ...), a pilgrimage to the sites associated with the Salvador martyrs, a torchlit procession and an all-night vigil on Saturday. Plus lots of T-shirts and mugs for sale! It has been a moving experience for me: a reminder that being 'Corpus Christi', the body of Christ, can sometimes be a very costly business. I have prayed for Corpus Christi parish, at the altar where Archbishop Romero was killed, and I will continue to keep you in my prayers over this weekend."

6th Form, Secondary School Transfers Sept 2015 and Nursery/Reception Applications

The next of many 'drop-in' times when open appointments are available will be held in the Priest's House on: Thursday 20 Nov from 5-7pm for 12 families seeking Secondary School Transfer.

Before this meeting all parents applying for a reference should complete a Parish form called the "Initial Application for a School Reference from the Parish Priest" These forms can be collected from Fr Adrian after each Mass this weekend. Please compete and return this form in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name on the outside and clearly marked 'School Reference. To avoid any confusion: the Parish form is not the Priest's Reference that the schools either send out or give to the parents. If you have received a Priest's Reference from the school(s) you have applied to, please follow the instructions printed on that form AS EACH SCHOOL HAS A DIFFERENT PROCESS. If you have met Fr Adrian at one of the 'open drop-in' timeslots then all you need to do is:

- put the school's Priest's Reference form in an envelope clearly marked on the outside with your family name, the name of the child and the name of the school and post this through the door of the Priest's House, no. 11 Trent Road
- PLEASE NOTE: if the school has requested that a parent has to return the form then the form must be posted to Fr Adrian after any weekend Mass, so that the form can be collected from him after any Mass the following weekend
- if the school has requested that Fr Adrian has to return the form then the form must be accompanied by an envelope addressed to the school with a stamp attached sufficient for the postage required. A separate envelope is required for each school but if the form is for Corpus Christi Primary school only then no stamp or envelope is required as Fr Adrian will take the references himself
