### Preparing for the Visit of Bishop Patrick Lynch ss.cc

Last year we learned of the five-yearly Visitation of Bishop Pat that will occur in three weeks' time. The main focus of his visit will be our Parish Vigil Mass on 7 March as we welcome the families of the 32 people who will be Confirmed, but an open invitation is issued to all the Parish to join us for a Mass at 7.30pm on Friday 6 March for the repose of the soul of Fr Tom. Prior to that Bishop Pat will be visiting Windmill Lodge, preceded by a Lenten soup lunch hosted by the UCM on Friday 6 March from 1-2pm in the Parish Hall. If you are able to come to any of these events please do so, but Bishop Pat will be available after most of the Masses that weekend.

### PAYDAY LOAN STORIES

CITIZENS Corpus Christi Parish is one a number of local groups that make up Lambeth Citizens, an alliance formed to help promote the common good of society. Following a meeting at Corpus Christi this week we would like to gather stories from a range of people who have experience of using payday loans. We would like to hear from all payday loan users and are particularly interested in the company 'Speedy Cash'. Lambeth Citizens is currently negotiating with 'Speedy Cash', asking them to reconsider practices that some could find potentially exploitative. For example, 'Speedy Cash' have a scheme to give people £20 if they introduce a friend who takes out a payday loan. 
