Today we contemplate the Most Holy Trinity as Jesus introduced us to it. He revealed to us that God is love not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. He is the Creator and merciful Father; he is the Only-Begotten Son, eternal Wisdom incarnate, who died and rose for us; he is the Holy Spirit who moves all things, cosmos and history, toward their final, full recapitulation. **Three Persons who are one God because the Father is love, the Son is love, the Spirit is love. Congratulations to Bishop Richard Moth on becoming the Fifth Bishop of Arundel and Brighton. Bishop Moth was ordained a priest in 1982 and served as a priest in parishes in the Archdiocese of Southwark including acting as Vicar General and Chancellor of the Archdiocese before being ordained Bishop of the Forces in September 2009. Bishop Richard is also Chair of Governors at St Mary's University, Twickenham, Liaison Bishop for Prisons, Episcopal Advisor to the National Catholic Scout Fellowship and holds the brief on Mental Health for the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. Bishop Richard Moth said: "It is a great privilege to have been appointed by Pope Francis as the new Bishop of Arundel and Brighton and I am very conscious of the trust that has been placed in me. In these last fifty years since the foundation of the Diocese, so much has been done to build up the Church and in the proclamation of the Gospel and, with God's help, I look to guide and serve the Diocese to that same end." He also acknowledged the work of Archbishop Peter Smith as Apostolic Administrator and said: "I am especially grateful to Archbishop Peter Smith for all he has done in recent months to support and guide the Diocese."

As we continue to keep the migrants around the Mediterranean and Aegean regions in our prayers, **Bishop Declan Lang, Chair of the International Affairs Department of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales** stated this week that "The escalating humanitarian crisis facing the Rohingya people cannot be ignored by the international community. It is more important than ever that Burma's authorities take decisive action to end the persecution, destitution and intercommunal tensions that are forcing thousands of people into perilous journeys on the Andaman Sea. Neighbouring states such as Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia and the Philippines must also fulfil their own responsibilities to rescue those in danger and treat them in accordance with international law. **I hope that the British government will work with its partners in the region to alleviate the crisis and that Catholics throughout England and Wales will join me in praying for our Rohingya brothers and sisters.**"
