#### Living the Word for children through the week ...

Why not try making some bread with an adult? You will need the following:

700g strong white flour, 1 level teaspoon of salt, 1 level teaspoon of dried yeast, 1 level teaspoon of caster sugar and about 425ml of warm water. Mix the flour, the salt yeast and sugar. Then make a well in the mixture and add the water – just enough to make a soft dough. Put on a flat surface and knead until springy and smooth. Put the mixture into a bowl, cover it and leave in a warm place for approximately 1-2 hours. Take it from the bowl and knead again for around 1-2 minutes. Put the dough into a bread tin, leave to prove again for about 20 minutes. Then bake in the oven at Gas 7, 200C or 400F for 30 – 40 minutes. Be sure to let it cool before trying.

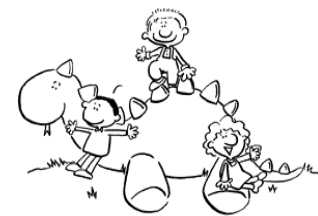


#### Family Prayer
