As many were away last weekend some of our items have been repeated this week to help spread the news.

Given the dreadful risk so many migrants are taking to come into Europe and the appalling loss of life through tragedy and trafficking, our Bishops are calling for reflection and action: "The current migration crisis is complex and there are no easy solutions for governments, non-governmental organisations, faith groups and charities working on the field. However, governments, charities and humanitarian aid agencies should be encouraged to work together for a collaborative international response to the challenge in partnership with the countries of origin. Countries of origin must recognise that 'the defence of migrants rights' is viable and effective when based on a firm foundation of legal norms, and operates under the rule of law" (Caritas Europa).

Children's Liturgy News

Our children's liturgy pauses over the summer while many of our parish families are on holiday. We look forward to seeing you when you come back and resume on Sunday 13 September. Changes to our music groups on a Sunday mean that from October the Family Mass will move from being on the first Sunday of every month to the third Sunday of every month so please make a note.
