

A lot of work has been going on to ensure our parish is here for many years to come, for example the ongoing work to repair the rain damage to the roof and walls of the church and house and the refurbishment of our hall facilities to allow for the needs of our Senior Lunch Club, so THANK YOU to all those who coordinated, celebrated and came along to make this year's Summer Fair such a fantastic family event. We managed to raise a little under £4000.00 on the day.



The remedial repairs and the refurbishment work to the Presbytery have begun in earnest over the last couple of weeks and will last until September. During this time, 11 Trent Road will be an off-limits building site and the Parish Office will be based in

As the Presbytery will be uninhabitable for about three months, I am currently living at St George's Cathedral and have joined the life of so many parishioners who have a daily commute (it's a bit longer than the usual walk across
