1st Holy Communion, Confirmation and Parish News

Thank you to all the parents who were able to make it to the second application meeting last Wednesday. If you missed the meeting you missed the opportunity to collect an application form for each programme. Parents can collect an application from Fr Adrian after Mass but please note, your son or daughter needs to be there as well so that Fr Adrian can give you the sheet(s) that you missed and give a brief explanation to your child. Please note: for your child to be able to start the programme parents need to have attended the **two** catechetical meetings (on June 29 and July 13). The principle of the instruction is to give information about the programmes and to help parents reflect on how best they can help their children to prepare for the Sacraments. **Don't worry if, for whatever reason, you missed one (or both) of the sessions, as a further (combined) catechesis for parents will be held in September** (further details will be given nearer the time).

We have been blessed over the years to have had the support of many parents from our Parish helping as group leaders or helpers in our Catechetical programmes, together with the support of our local Religious Communities, namely the Holy Family Sisters, the Society of Jesus and the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary (FMM). The pressures of their own ministry outside of the Parish led us, first of all to say farewell to Sr. Irena three years ago and, since last November, the Jesuits have been able to help in the Parish less and less, leading to a farewell in March this year to Fr Michael Kirwan SJ, the last priest from the Society of Jesus to be able to help us. In addition to Fr Michael's help we have been blessed over the years to be supported by a number of Scholastics (those studying on the road to be deacons and priests) and, like the many priests and Scholastics who have helped us over the years, the current Scholastics will be sorely missed as they move on to pastures new.

We welcomed this March Fr Jake Dicto and Fr Mark Odion MSP, who were nominated by Bishop Pat Lynch ssc to help us temporarily on a Sunday in the absence of the Jesuits until their position in the Parish became clearer. **Having received a letter last week from Fr Dermot Preston SJ, the Jesuit Provincial, that path is now evident, as the three Jesuit community houses within our Parish are to be privately leased when the Community takes leave of them this autumn.** Our thanks go to Fr Michael Kirwan SJ, the previous Community Superior and his successor, Fr Dorian Llewelyn SJ, on behalf of all the priests and Scholastics who have helped over the years; but **we are extremely grateful to all the FMM Sisters who continue to be an active and supportive presence within our Parish Family.** With the final move of the Jesuits **we welcome a new priest to our Parish Family, Fr David Howell, who was ordained by Archbishop Peter Smith this Saturday in St George's Cathedral.** Archbishop Peter has appointed Fr David to be an Assistant Priest in the Parish from this September, hence the work on the Presbytery to be able to make it habitable by then. As we pray in thanksgiving for the work of the Jesuits, please keep Fr David in your prayers as it will be an honour and a great blessing to welcome a newly ordained priest to our Parish Family and for him to work alongside our parents and families in the forthcoming Communion and Confirmation Programmes.
