#### PREPARING TO CELEBRATE THE HOLY SOULS

"Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable - if anything is excellent or praiseworthy - think about such things." Philippians 4:8

In this quote St. Paul writes to the Church of his day to encourage them in their Christian life. At this time of year, when many begin to turn to Halloween and thoughts of wizards, witches, and ghosts, **the Church has a more positive way to celebrate and remember our past, much more in line with St. Paul's encouragement!** Each November the Church takes time to remember those who have died and makes the positive step of praying and offering Mass for the repose of their souls. Following this tradition, we will have the opportunity to request Masses for the Holy Souls and write lists of remembrance. **This year All Saints falls on a Tuesday and as it is a Holy Day of Obligation there will be Mass at 9.30 am and 7.30 pm in the evening.** We will be remembering especially all those who have died at each of our Sunday Masses and November Lists of Remembrance can be placed in the basket by the Altar at any time. Thank you.

#### SEARCHING FOR MORE ABOUT OUR FAITH?

Every year in our parish a number of adults are Baptised and welcomed into 'Full-Communion' in the Church. Many different reasons can prompt a person to seek baptism, to grow in Christian faith and to be received into the Church. It can be a deeply felt longing in a person's heart "for something else, different, better". It might be the example of a work colleague, or the encouragement of spouse and children. Whatever, or whoever gives the 'final push' we can be certain that the Holy Spirit has had a hand in it too. When a person wants to join the Church the local parish family has a sacred responsibility to welcome and help that person and if possible integrate him or her into the believing, worshipping community of the Faith. When we walk along with candidates for baptism and reception, we very naturally search our own hearts to see where we stand in relation to the Lord and to one another.

This autumn we'll begin again our **Faith Enquiry Group** for those who want to learn more or learn anew about our Catholic faith, so please see Fr. Adrian for further details and take an opportunity to reflect whether you might like to learn more yourself as **the group is open to all**, whether new to the faith or Catholic for years. So, why not come along to help support someone in their journey of faith?

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION NEWS

Please note, our First Holy Communion and Confirmation programmes begin this week with the Communion classes in either the school classrooms or Parish Hall and the Confirmation meeting for parents and candidates in the Hall. This year we have a trial of running the First Holy Communion classes using the school facilities and it is hoped that next year, after the trial has been reviewed, there will be one class on offer. As we have such a large number of candidates, we have had to run two classes this year. **If your child is at Corpus Christi School, please ensure your child has a healthy snack to eat before the Communion Class which takes place 3.30 – 4.30 pm on Thursday 3 November.** Children in our Sunday Communion classes need to be in the hall ready to start at 5 pm on Sunday November 6 (biscuits and squash will be provided). The Sunday class will end in time for the 6 pm Mass, to which candidates and their families are asked to attend if they haven't been to Mass already.

Our Confirmation Programme begins with a meeting for parents and candidates in the Parish Hall on Friday 4 November, starting promptly at 7.30 pm and running for an hour. Please note: some parents have been invited to an extra meeting on Fri 11 November at 7.30 pm in the Church if they missed one or more of the parents' meetings.
