'Our little systems have their day, they have their day and cease to be; they are but broken lights of thee, and thou, O Lord, are more than they.'

The death of former prime minister Margaret Thatcher has aroused many feelings among those who remember her epochal days in office. These feelings span almost the whole emotional spectrum and it would be inappropriate here to express any personal view.

That is why Tennyson's lines come to the rescue. In the face of the death of a great national leader -greatness being measured in terms of their impact on the life and history of a nation and beyond - it would be peevishly partisan to deny her stature; economic revolutionary, victor in war, first woman leader, icon of freedom.

Her 'little systems' pursued with such courage and will, had their effects, but at the cost of a bitterly split nation. If these effects have not yet ceased to be, Britain is now entering a phase which will require both realism and a touch that must reach all classes.

For her systems really were broken lights. They provided new heart, fresh energies and Desperately needed change - dimmed by divisions so deep that the shadows linger in the regions laid waste by industrial civil war.

On taking office, Lady Thatcher quoted the prayer of St Francis - an episode that came back to haunt her. Let us now pray that she will receive *'in injury, pardon.. and in dying, to be re-born to eternal life.'* Fr Barry
