Fr Barry writes...

A parishioner once told me how, accidentally, her elderly tortoise had been left out in the garden one night. It was found the next morning with part of a foot bitten off by a young fox. The tortoise convalesced happily for a while but, despite all efforts, did not survive.

The incident could be taken for a metaphor of the struggle between old age and youth. A recent survey tells us that the young have no time for religion, are far more influenced by celebrities and insist on 'doing my own thing'.

The late Cardinal Martini explored more deeply the changes in thinking which have so effected the modern age, especially youth. Previously, he said, we had taken for granted the primacy of truth and values over feelings, of intelligence over will, of the Spirit over the flesh and of the eternal over the temporal.

But today there is a spontaneous preference for feeling over the will, for impressions over intelligence, and the search for pleasure over restraint. This is a world in which sensitivity, emotion and the present moment come first. Human existence is a place where a person exercises his personal empire and creativity.

'Truth cannot be verified', so we need to be always open to another and to what is different. All civilisations, religions and individuals are seen as equal. That is why Christianity is not easily accepted when it presents itself as uniquely true. Everyone has a right to be singular and affirm oneself. There is no sin, pardon or self denial.

Perhaps what Christians need most of all at this time, is the legendary patience of the tortoise.
