Fr Barry writes ..

Christians take it for granted that it's normal to be compassionate and affirmative towards people who are disabled or incapacitated. It's no big deal, we feel, to support others in need. However, recent events such as sporadic attacks on disabled individuals, targeting and abusing them and their carers, show that kindness is not inborn for all people.

Indeed, at the time of Our Lord it was the common attitude to see the blind, the crippled, the sick, the disfigured as hateful specimens whose suffering was the result of their follies and sins or those of their ancestors. They were shunned and vilified. That's precisely why Christ's approach was so revolutionary. Through the Christian people it needs to be renewed and refreshed in each generation.

What some find puzzling is that some persons evidently blessed with every good physical attribute should seek further perfection. The phenomenon is illustrated by the boom in cosmetic surgery. Christian responses to this vary. Decrying vanity, some insist that we should make do with the faces and bodies that God has given us. Others opt for a freer approach in which how we spend our own money without harming others, while adding to the sum of human beauty, is acceptable.

A difficulty is that beauty is so subjective. One might be misguidedly tormented with the thought of having too big a nose. Another might be saddled with features that would tax a Hogarth, yet be vibrantly self confident. A little balance and tolerance is called for in my view. As the poet Yeats counselled vulnerable women: '*....'tis only God, my dear, who loves you for yourself alone, and not your yellow hair*'.
