Fr Barry writes...

Pope Francis' refreshingly American '*tell it like it is*' style is not afraid of targeting sensitive aspects of Church life which he believes needs renewal. His comments about '*antique collectors*' and careerists among priests and bishops are of interest beyond the professional.

For me, the task of priests is to travel along the road of life with people. The word companion is from the Latin - to share bread. A priest is someone who shares the Bread of Life. Only he can consecrate it, but it is something to give to others. A true priest will have a much broader sense of sharing bread. He will journey with people, often on sad or perplexing roads insisting that God is always with them and loves them.

He will be with them at pivotal sacramental moments and seemingly banal experiences. He will be found in the slums, the hospitals, the prisons, the schools, the workplace, the pub - wherever Jesus would want to be to encourage the struggling soul.

What a sad thing it is to note that the divorced and remarried, the family planners, the gays and even other Christians are excluded from the table. '*I am a man*', said the Roman writer Terence, '*Everything human interests me*'. It is the sentiments that mirrors every word that Christ spoke, and should be the spark for priestly service.
