Fr Barry writes ...

New stirrings in the Church have brought into focus once more the question that will not go away: why can't women be ordained? This time the prospects are being framed more realistically. Pope John Paul's blanket ban even on discussing the subject (as though we were all medieval peasants!) has meant the idea of women priests is still off-limits.

What is being opened up is the possibility of women being able to preach, conduct weddings, baptisms and funerals - as deacons. The engines of change include the German bishops, impressed by the fact that 85% of those working in lay ministries are female, the success of women's ordination in reformation churches and the need to assuage women's frustration .

Important also is the retrieval of sound scholarship in support of change. This points to the existence of women deacons in the early Church where they played an important role. The breakthrough on this matter came in 2009 when a new item was added to canon law. A distinction was made between the priest as an 'icon' of Christ, acting in the person of Christ as the Church's bridegroom, and the deacon, seen simply as providing an important 'service' in liturgy and charity.

Only a male can be an 'icon' whereas both men and women can serve. There are still a host of problems to be addressed, especially the fact that deacons are unquestionably part of the sacrament of Holy Orders – reserved to men. There is resistance to a 'grade two' diaconate in which women would not be ordained, but could carry out many diaconal functions.

Nevertheless, especially under a possibly more sympathetic pope, the future looks much brighter for women.
