School Playground

It is with regret that the school playground will have to be closed permanently on a Sunday morning. This is due to the lack of supervision and the difficulty in finding more than one adult to take responsibility for the playground and to enforce the few rules imposed on us.

There are over 60,000 children in the care of local authorities and finding homes for these children is one of our priorities. At Cabrini, we offer foster placements to children who cannot stay with their birth families, where all other placement options have been exhausted. These children will have experienced disruption, trauma and loss. As a charity specialising in long term foster care, we are looking for people who are committed, flexible, patient and understanding to provide a stable, loving home for vulnerable children until they are at least 18 years old. MY ROMAN seminary studies were pleasantly interrupted one weekend when the Italian television news flashed a clip from home - it was the London Marathon. Our common room exploded with laughter when a shot zoomed in on one runner bringing up the rear. He was dressed as a bishop clinging to his toppling mitre and trailing crozier. What a refreshing contrast this image presented to us, surrounded as we were by the steely careerism of the prim prelates we had to encounter daily in the eternal city !

This memory came back to me on Sunday when I was able to watch the happy spectacle of the marathon, as thrilling as ever. This country likes to wrap up its support of good causes in a bundle of fun. I was glad to see some representatives of churches among the contestants.

An old priest in Dorset once told me that unity of charity would prove to be what was most important and enduring in the ecumenical movement. The present hold-up in doctrinal progress seems to bear out his words.

But I would go beyond this and suggest that unity in charity extend its reach to everybody.

Points of contact with non-churchgoers in events like the marathon in support of a common ideal are precious.

The dehumanizing forces in our society – from impersonal processes, the state, finance, the military-industrial complex – are so powerful that all people of good will must work together to ‘salvage the human’.

Fussy details that impede the rays of God’s love need to be set aside so that we can work in tandem towards the good life for all. As believers our contribution towards achieving the peak human flourishing is vital.
