Fr Barry writes...

'The Population Problem' always provided some critics with a good opportunity to knock the Church, with its blessing for ample families, because in those days it was assumed that there were going to be too many people to feed from the earth's resources.

Today things have changed. It is true there are particular places where the pressures of growing population are cause for concern, but in Europe the 'population problem' arises from the predicted steep decline in population. In some countries, such as Germany and even Italy, the birth rate has fallen well below replacement level and in the long run these states would face extinction without immigration.

One result of the collapse in the birth rate – and this is a problem too in China because of its benighted one-baby-only policy – is that such societies are rapidly aging. A smaller younger population is having to support a burgeoning pensioner class. This is suffering a huge rise in the numbers of those with dementia, with all the ensuing consequences.

Once when I was chaplain to a large convent of retired teaching nuns, one sister came to see me expressing her fears. '*What I dread most of all*' she said '*is that I will forget who Jesus is*'. That little encounter sharpened my perception not only of Alzheimers, but also of its impact on believers. All I could do was to assure sister that only one thing was certain in that situation – that Christ would never forget who SHE was.
