Fr Barry writes ..

Many older Catholics fondly recall the days of processions, May crownings, daily family rosary and special sermons about Our Lady in the month devoted to her. So, where have all these flowers gone, and why? One simple answer is that May often occurs in Eastertide and it is only right that the emphasis in the liturgy should be focused on the Resurrection, but there are wider issues involved.

In placing its teaching on Mary in the document on the Church, the fathers of the Second Vatican Council showed more clearly what Mary's place is in the Christian life. She is the type that the Church is to be, she is the outstanding model in faith and charity.

So the council has brought Mary closer to our Christian lives by presenting her as a member of the Church we can imitate. There are two main ways of looking at Our Lady. In the first, her privileges are stressed – someone who is like Christ and so very far from us. This sinless Mary can be admired but not imitated. The second approach doesn't deny her uniqueness, but stresses her oneness with us. Instead of focusing on her privileges, it highlights the fact that she is human, that she needed redemption, that besides being his mother, she is also Christ's disciple. This view sees Mary's prime role as the first and most perfect disciple of Christ.

It helps us to see Mary in a model of what a life of discipleship means. It calls us to a place at her side as co-disciples who want to work for the coming of God's kingdom on earth.

A true Marian theology views Mary in the context of the Trinity's plan for the salvation of the human race. Devotions that isolate Mary, and raise her to quasi-divine status are unsuitable. Marian devotion needs to be rooted in the liturgy and the Bible.

That this thoroughly modern Mary can still inspire great work is shown in the success of the movement *Mary's Meals* founded in the last decade by a young Scotsman under her patronage. It is now feeding hundreds of thousands of schoolchildren each day in Africa.
