Fr Barry writes...

The coming year will be marked by many commemorations of the industrialised slaughter of the first world war. Few families or institutions escaped the impact of imperial ambition. Yet many thousands of soldiers became Catholics. Perhaps this was the result of the desperation summed up in the saying '*there are no atheists in the slip trenches*'. Another reason could be the example of such heroic chaplains as Fr Willie Doyle SJ.

After the war he was much in demand as a retreat giver. He used to advise the retreatants: '*avoid the three Ds – the Devil, the Doctor and the Dumps*'. The Devil should be fled from for obvious reasons. The Doctor because medical bills were a grievous burden on the poor. The Dumps because being down in the dumps was a contagious misery which destroyed Christian hope and joy.

The three Ds still exert a powerful hold. Regional wars rumble ominously, mass slaughter now includes the abortion clinics and as a farmer aged 101, whom I met in the Kerry hills last week, pithily put it, '*tis greed that's killing us all*'. All this is evidence of satanic rule.

The doctors are as costly as ever, though this is partially masked by the taxation that supports the NHS. And the Prozac generation has no need to be reminded of the prevalence of depression. The details change, but the dangers remain the same.

So – avoid the three Ds!
