Thank you to all those who were able to contribute to last week's second collection to support the work of Missio, the Mission-based charity of our Church. Missio has asked for prayers for the people of the Philippines, devastated when an earthquake and typhoon hit the country on Tuesday, 15th October 2013. 110 people lost their lives and some of their ancient churches were reduced to rubble. The 7.2 magnitude earthquake brought down the bell-tower of the Basilica of Santo Niño (the Holy Child) at Cebu, a National Shrine in the Philippines. Fr Socrates Mesiona, MSP, National Director of Missio in the Philippines, has emailed Mgr Canon James Cronin asking for our prayers for those who have lost members of their families or whose homes and farms have been damaged or destroyed. We join our prayers with the Filipino Community in our diocese and beyond. They have regularly celebrated the Feast of Santo Niño - the devotion dates back 450 years - at Saint George's Cathedral each January.



A MESSENGER OF HOPE FROM PADUA, ITALY

The Franciscan Friars invite you to join them in welcoming Saint Anthony of Padua on the occasion of the 750th Anniversary of the Discovery of Saint Anthony's Relics by Saint Bonaventure. St Anthony will be visiting in the form two precious relics from his Basilica in Padua, Italy. The relics will be accompanied by three friars from the Messenger of Saint Anthony in Padua and the Greyfriars of Great Britain and Ireland on FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 1 at our Diocesan Cathedral, St George's, Southwark, Lambeth Road, Lambeth North, London SE1 6HX (many buses e.g. 159 or 59 go straight from Brixton to Lambeth North). There will be: **Veneration from 5:30 pm then Mass at 6 pm followed by a further period of veneration from 7 to 9.30 pm** Prior to the relics arriving in the UK Fr Adrian made a short pilgrimage to Padua and prayed for our Parish directly at the tomb of St Anthony and at the Shrine of the Relics. Please join in asking for the intercession of St. Anthony by joining in the pilgrimage of the relics or by praying at our own statue of St Anthony in the Parish.
