6th March Memorial Mass for Fr Tom • 15th March St Patrick's Party in Corpus Christi School • 17th March Fr Adrian's Mass of Induction

A message from Fr Adrian: "Last year celebrations for St Patrick's were cancelled in the parish in respect of how soon it was after Fr Tom's death and I am aware that some of the school parents and parish members are asking when the Induction is. Bishop Patrick Lynch has given the date for my Induction Mass (the Mass where a Parish Priest is welcomed into the community) as 17th March, the Feast of St Patrick. This date holds significance not only because of our annual celebrations for the Feast of St Patrick, but because last year many were able to attend a Vigil Mass for Fr Tom, whose funeral was held the next day on 18th March.

On the actual anniversary of Fr Tom's death, 6th March, we have a Requiem Mass, to which everyone is invited, at 7.30 pm, but we will also be holding a whole-school Mass for Fr Tom at 9.30 am on Ash Wednesday, the day before. I will lead prayers for Fr Tom at the Mass of Induction but also for Cllr Mark Bennett, who has just died so suddenly, as Cllr Bennett had planned to be at the Induction in his capacity as Mayor of Lambeth.

Although there will be a reception in the school hall after the Induction Mass, I would like to emphasise that this is not intended to take the place of any joint Parish/School celebrations for St Patrick that are due to be held on Friday 15th March. I have asked that the St Patrick celebrations go ahead in the school rather than be postponed, as this will be an opportunity for me to gather with many of the families who cannot be present at the Induction, as 17th March falls on a Monday evening. As the Feast of St Patrick falls when it does it may be difficult for some to attend but (as my family are Scots/Irish) I would like this to be an opportunity where we can gather together as a parish and school family, to look to the past to continue the wonderful work Fr Tom did; to look to the future to help build our community together and to celebrate and call upon the prayers of St Patrick to guide us all in the way ahead.

May God continue to bless you and all the family,

The season of school references has not entirely finished but you may be interested to know that it has been independently verified that to date Fr Adrian has completed **444** parish references for **120** nursery/primary applications and **60** secondary school applications. These applications were to **37** different nursery/primary schools and **38** different secondary schools. **Sadly only 32% of the primary schools and only 40% of the secondary schools were Catholic.** This does reflect the difficulty parents have in obtaining a Catholic place, reflected also in how well over a third [37%] of last year's Corpus Christi Year 6 leavers went to non-Catholic Schools.
