The third Sunday of January is designated by the bishops of England and Wales as Peace Sunday, a day of prayer for world peace. Each year the Holy Father writes a message for World Peace Day, celebrated on 1 January in Rome and elsewhere, and for 2015 Pope Francis's message is No longer slaves, but brothers and sisters.

Pope Francis's Message for World Peace Day

As part of our Parish Review we are Slavery today is seen as a crime against humanity. looking at the range and opportunities Yet millions of people - children, men, and women of all we have for music and singing within ages - are deprived of freedom and forced to live in the Mass. We are blessed to have conditions akin to slavery. A means there. If you are interested in singing or playing an to an end Not as human beings created in the image and likeness of God Let us not be indifferent to their Fr Adrian or Larissa Murray. There'll be no commitment suffering In your own lives, as a community, let us stand in solidarity with victims of slavery - when we meet people who could be victims of human trafficking - when we are tempted to buy cheap clothes, technology, which may have been produced through exploitation. A kind word, a greeting, and a smile cost nothing but can offer hope, open doors, and transform lives. I appeal to all people of good will: Do not turn away from the suffering of our brothers and sisters
