

Lambeth Council, in partnership with Lambeth Citizens, have launched a new campaign to promote the take-up of credit union membership in Lambeth: Lambeth Credit Union Champions. Through this scheme, Lambeth Council are offering financial incentives to encourage residents to open savings and current accounts with the London Mutual Credit Union, such as £10 upfront payment for everyone who opens a membership (savings) account and £26 for everyone who opens a current account and keeps it open for 6 months. This will be paid at the 6-month point, and covers the £1 per week account fee. Having a membership with the Credit Union will also give residents access to loan facilities (including a pay day loan), which provide an affordable alternative to high-cost high street lenders.
